<u>HK TWf Behavioural Safety in Temporary Works Management</u> seminar on Saturday 11th January 2020.

On the 11th of January The Hong Kong Temporary Works Forum (HK TWf) and the Institute of Civil Engineers (HK) held the second of their joint seminars associated with temporary works.
